




Fig.1 Power Dissipation Derating Curve

Fig.2 Drain Current Derating Curve





Fig.3 Typical Output Characteristics(I)

Fig.4 Typical Output Characteristics(II)





Fig.6 Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig.7 Gate Threshold Voltage vs. Junction Temperature








Fig.8 Forward Transfer Admittance vs. Drain Current





Fig.13 Static Drain - Source On - State Resistance vs. Drain Current (III)

Fig.15 Static Drain - Source On - State


Resistance vs. Drain Current (V)

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

### Fig.18 Switching Characteristics





Fig.19 Source Current vs. Source Drain Voltage







